FLU VACCINATION PROGRAMME—2016/2017

Its that time of year again! The Flu Vaccination programme for winter 2016/17 will officially begin on 3rd October 2016. The Flu Vaccination is available to everyone aged

Flu is more serious than you think

Get the vaccine now

65 years and over or, if you are in a clinical risk group such as — suffering from Diabetes, Heart Disease, Asthma, COPD, Renal Disease, Liver Disease, BMI of 40 and over or if your are a carer.

If you are **Immunosuppressed**, by this we mean , due to a particular medication or undergoing chemotherapy you will be included in a **'risk group'** and will also be offered the vaccination. Again this year, **all pregnant women** at any stage of pregnancy (first, second or third trimesters) will be given the flu vaccine in the practice.

Also being vaccinated this year, in the practice, are all pre-school children aged 2 years and over, on 1st September 2016 - that is children born between 2nd July 2012 and 1st September 2014.

Please note—all children attending P1 to P7—primary school (**DOB 2nd July 2005 to 1st July 2012**) will be offered the flu vaccination **by the school health team.**

Please contact reception now to make an appointment with the Treatment Room Staff, for one of our flu clinics—you do not need to wait for a telephone call or a postal invitation.

The flu vaccine protects against the 3 most common strains of flu.:

- an A/California/7/2009 (H1N1) pdm09 –like virus
- an A/Hong Kong /4801/2014 (H3N2) like virus
- a B/Brisbane/60/2008 -like virus.



SHINGLES VACCINATION PROGRAMME 2016/17

The Shingles Vaccination is available from 3rd October 2016 and will be given to all patients aged 70 and 78 years on 1st September 2016.



Please see below for full explanation of eligibility:

- Patients Age 70 years on 1st September 2016 (Birth date range 02/09/1945 to 01/09/1946
- Patients Age 78 years on 1^{st} September 2016 (Birth date range -02/09/1937 to 01/09/1938).

<u>Please note</u>: anyone who was eligible for the shingles vaccine in the previous years but has not received it, and is not yet 80 years old, (those now aged 71, 72,73 and 79) can also be given the vaccine.
